








**APPLICATIONS TO BE DOWNLOADED ON YOUR SMARTPHONES**

	<p>Wordreference*</p> <p>The only dictionary that you should use. There is a forum linked to it so you can even find sentences translated for you. You can also get the right pronunciation</p> 
	<p>Linguee</p> <p>An interesting app if you want to find the translation of technical terms.</p>
	<p>BBC</p> <p>To listen to or read the news. Rather short articles.</p>
	<p>The Guardian</p> <p>A real source of inspiration for the various juries. So, get used to reading some articles here.</p>
	<p>Padlet</p> <p>I regularly select articles, videos or pictures and post them here to help you get the essential of the news.</p> <p><b>Subscribe to be notified when a new video is uploaded!</b></p> 
	<p>Tandem</p> <p>To chat with English speakers, ask for a partner over 50 years old who is looking for a French person to improve their French. This way, you'll have the chance to talk and text regularly. The idea is to split your conversation into two parts: one in English and one in French.</p>
