This is due to her belated nomination and enables her to avoid the left-wing pressures that complicated Clinton’s bid. ○ Like H. Clinton she promised to be a president for all Americans regardless of their party leaning. 2. Yet, she has some Challenges to overcome <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Despite avoiding factional issues, Harris must still address controversies and navigate the complexities of her vice presidency.
